

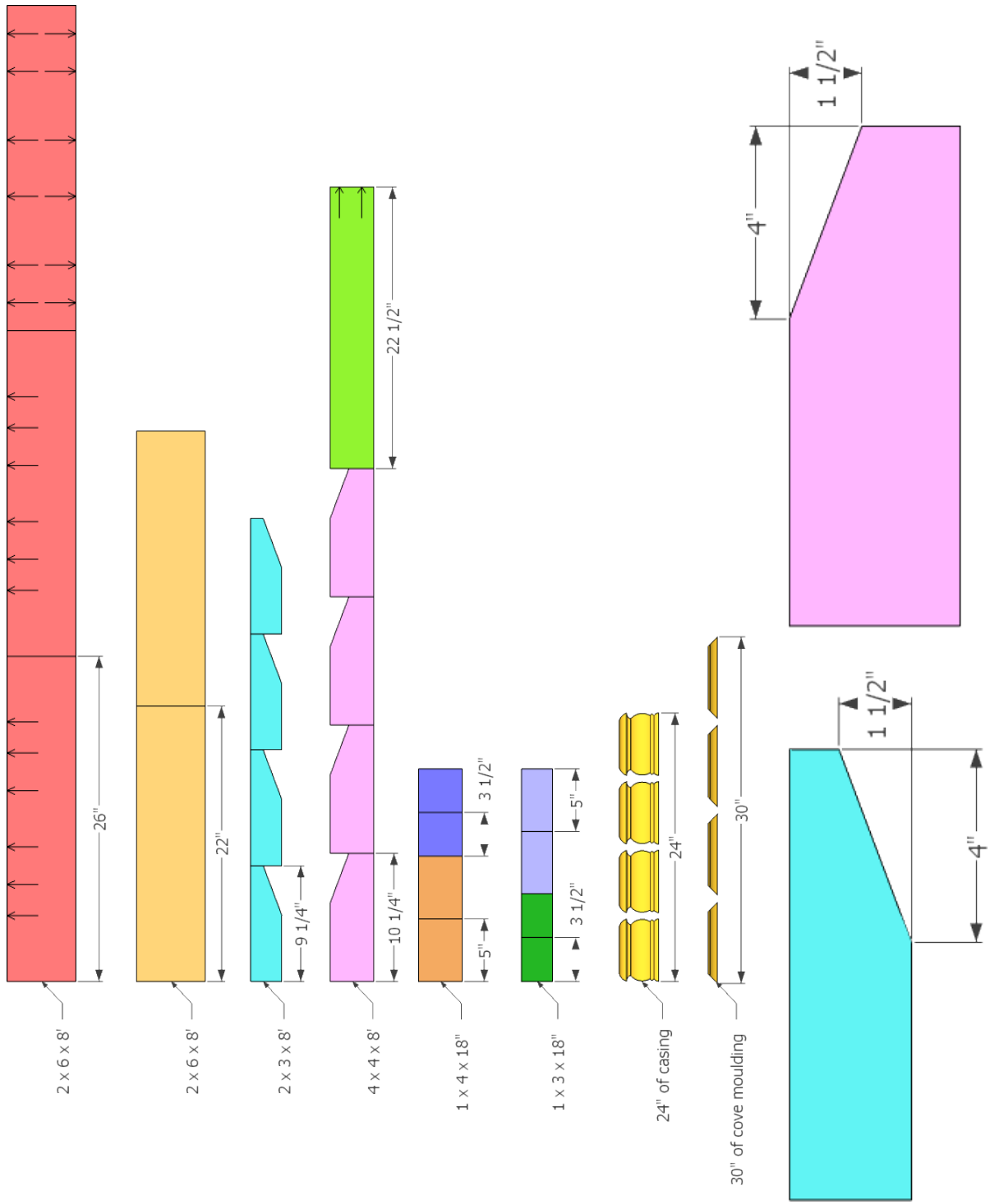
Pedestal Table

2 x 6 x 8	2	Pine or whitewood board
2 x 3 x 8'	1	Pine or whitewood board
4 x 4 x 8'	1	Pine or whitewood board
1 x 4 x 18"	1	Pine or whitewood board
1 x 3 x 18"	1	Pine or whitewood board
24" of casing moulding	1	
30" of cove moulding	1	
Wood glue		
2-1/2" pocket hole screws	56	
3" wood screws	4	To attach the top braces to the top
Finish of choice		

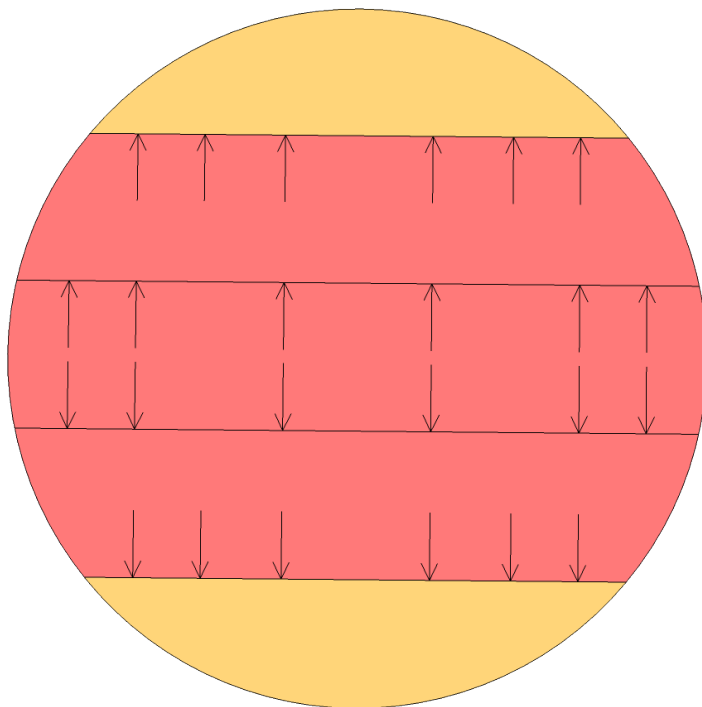
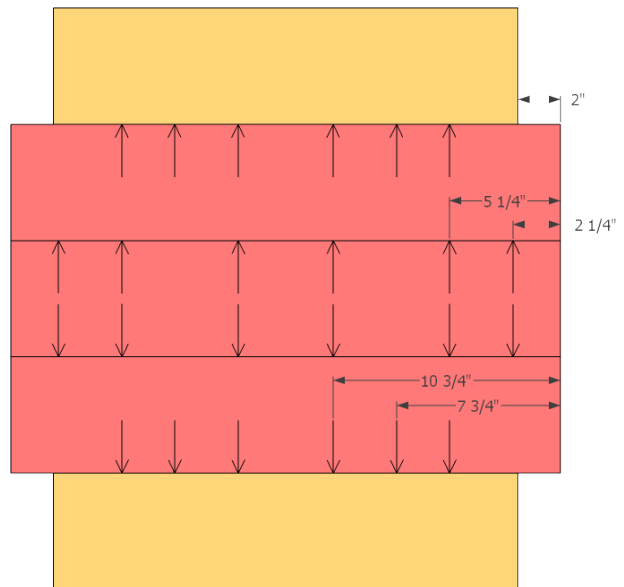
Drill pocket holes for 2-1/2" pocket hole screws as indicated by the arrows. Some pocket holes will be needed to make as you build.



Angle detail. Feel free to get as fancy as you want with a custom design here!

Use wood glue at every joint in this project. Assemble the top blank according to these dimensions. All measurements are symmetrical.

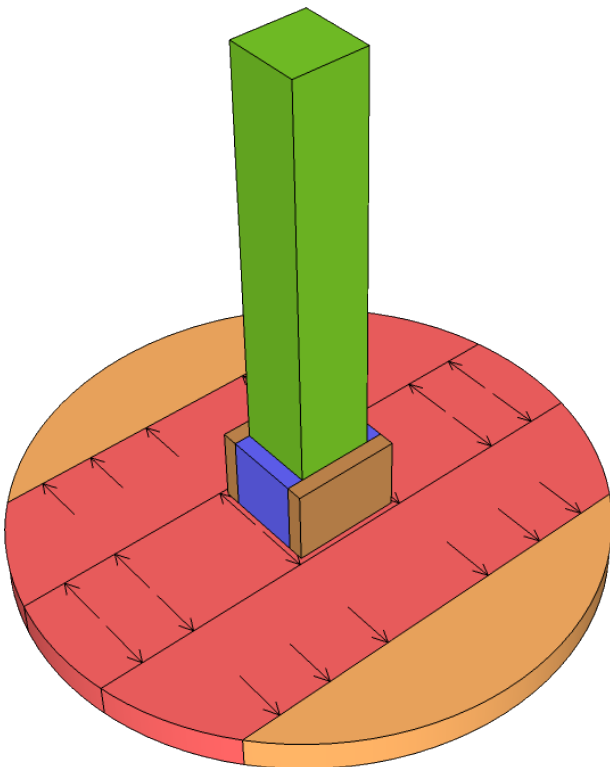
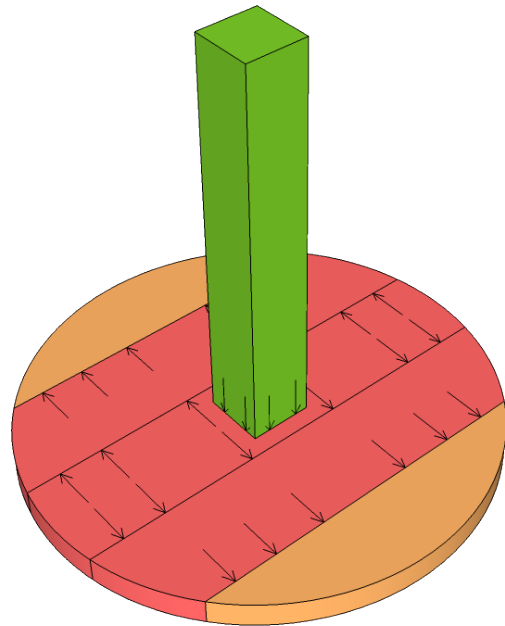

Find the center point of the table, Draw a 26" diameter or 13" radius circle and cut out the top with a jigsaw or a bandsaw.

Drill pocket holes on each face of the leg to attach it to the bottom of the table top. Then attach it to the bottom of the table top right in the center.

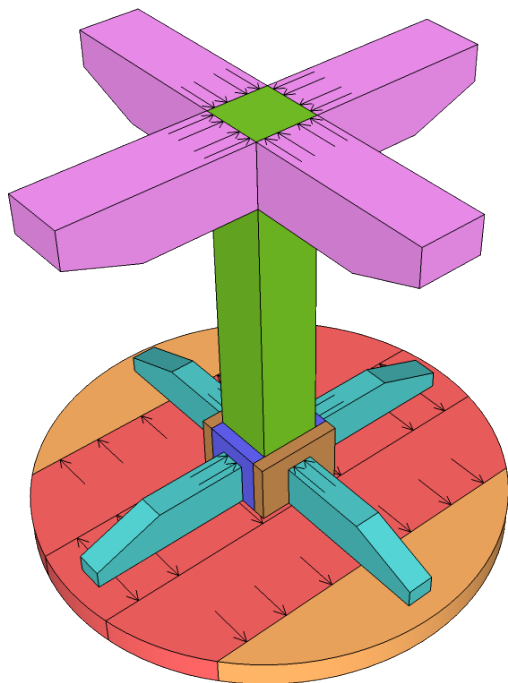
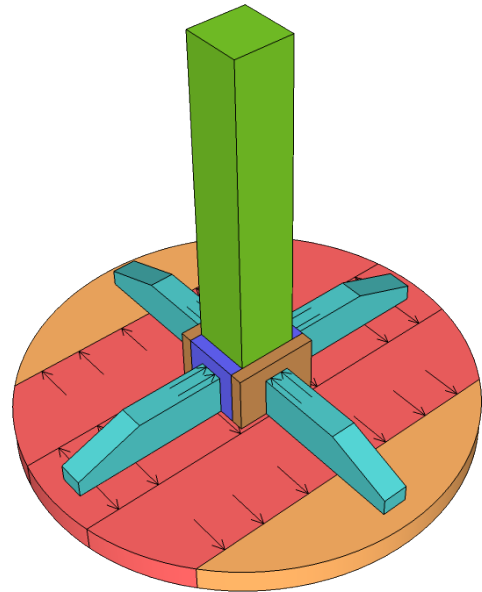

Use pieces of 1 x 4 to cover up the pocket holes on the leg. Use wood glue and brad nails or finish nails to attach them.

Attach the braces with pocket holes on their bottom face and predrill and add one screw through the angled face into the bottom of the table top.

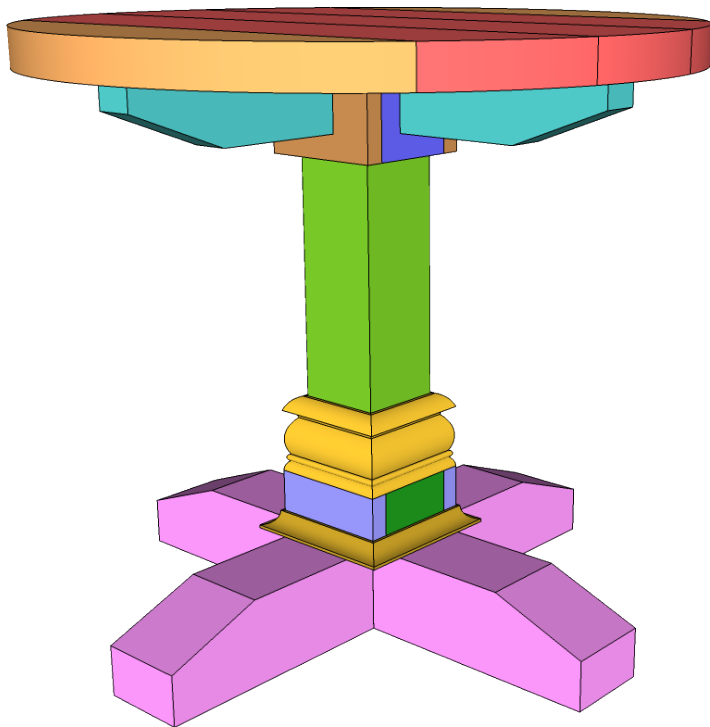
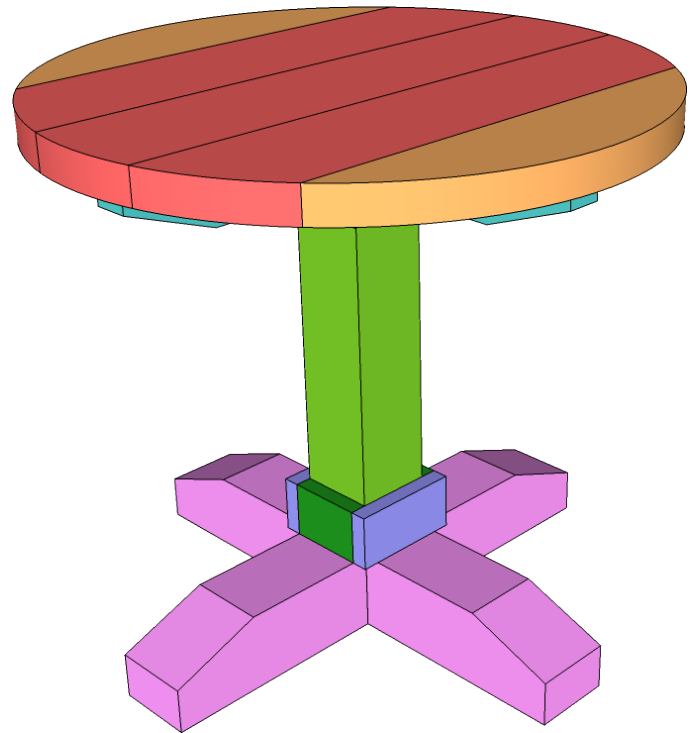

Carefully line up and install the feet with pocket holes from the bottom. If you accidentally get these out of alignment you can always add leg levelers to the bottom of the feet later.



Carefully flip the table over and wrap the leg with a layer of 1 x 3 with wood glue and brad nails or finish nails just as you did with the 1 x 4 boards previously.



Just above the 1 x 3 boards wrap the leg again with casing or any other moulding you prefer. Then wrap the 1 x 3 boards with a simple cove moulding. Fill any nail holes, sand, and finish as you wish!
