




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# LADDER BOOKCASE

Sawhorse Brackets	2	
1 1/4" brad nails		
1 1/4" wood screws		
wood glue



Make all of your cuts then attach the 18" rungs to the side ladder pieces with wood glue and 1 1/4" brad nails. The outside of the rungs should be flush with the outside of the long pieces.

Next, slide the sawhorse brackets over the top of each ladder.



Now, center the top piece inside the sawhorse brackets and pull the ladders apart, at the bottom, so that the sawhorse brackets sink into the top piece. Secure the brackets with 1 1/4" wood screws.




Slide the bottom shelf pieces onto the bottom set of rungs. There should be a 10" overhang on each side of the ladder. Secure them to the rungs with 1 1/4" brad nails.

Continue adding each row of shelves, attaching with brad nails as you go.
