



## Easy Planter Ladder

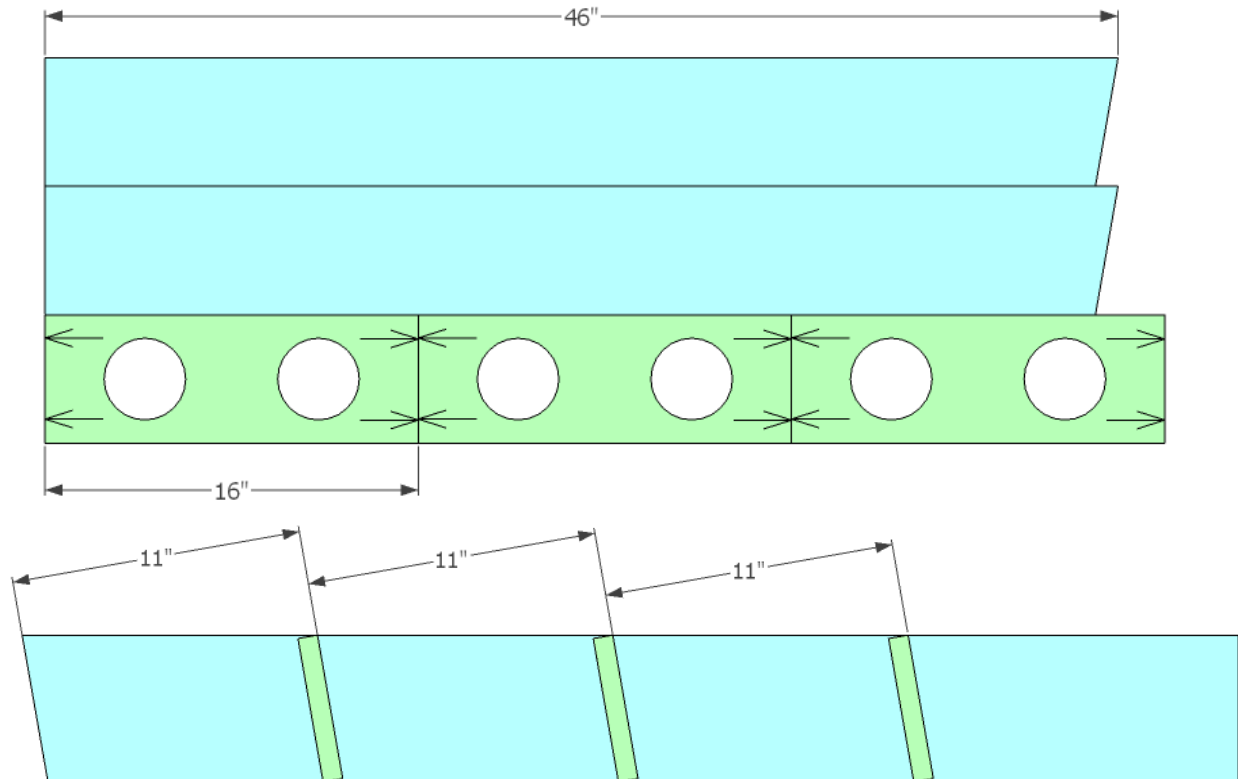
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### Supply List

Item	Quantity	Description
6' fence picket	3	Cedar
1-1/4" pocket hole screws	12	
Wood glue

Cut all of the pieces first. The bottom of the legs are cut at 10 degrees. The size of pots you use will determine how big the holes are. Cut your holes with a jigsaw and experiment with a piece of scrap first. Drill pocket holes for 1-1/4" pocket hole screws as indicated by the arrows. It may help to mark the location of the shelves on the legs before assembly. Each shelf is spaced at 11" starting from the bottom.

Using glue and pocket hole screws attach the shelves to one leg first. Make sure the pocket holes are facing down. Attach the other leg the same way. Sand and apply an outdoor finish if you want or let the cedar age naturally. If you decide to make one of these easy planter ladders be sure to stop by our website and let us know!
