


BARN DOOR NIGHTSTAND








Cut the back support to size. Drill 3/4" pocket hole screws and attach it to the top of the nightstand with 1 1/4" pocket screws and wood glue.




Cut the shelf trim to fit.
Attach with 1 1/4"
brad nails and wood glue.







Cut the face frame piece to fit. Drill 3/4" pocket holes, where noted. Attach the side pieces to the top and bottom pieces with 1 1/4" pocket screws and wood glue.



Attach the face frame to the nightstand with 1 1/4" brad nails and wood glue. The edges of the face frame should be flush with the edges of the nighstand.




Measure for the bottom side pieces of trim, first. Attach it to the bottom of the nightstand with 1 1/4" brad nails and wood glue. The edges of the trim should be flush with the back and front of the nightstand. Do this to both sides.




Once both side pieces are attached, measure and cut the front piece to fit. Attach the front piece with 1 1/4" brad nails and wood glue.




Flip the nighstand over to attach the top piece. Use the pocket holes that you drilled into the side pieces to attach the top. Make sure to use wood glue.



Measure and cut the top trim to fit. Start with the side pieces. They will be flush with the sides of the top. Then you can measure for the front trim piece. Attach with 1 1/4" brad nails and wood glue.









Measure and cut the 1/4" plywood to fit the back of the nightstand. Attach with 3/8" staples. The plywood should sit inside the 1/4" gap created on the back.



Cut the barn door pieces to size and drill 3/4" pocket holes in three of the boards. Attach the boards together with 1 1/4" pocket screws.
