



CUT LIST




First, build the frame of the bench. Drill 1/2" pocket holes at the ends of the long boards and 3/4" pocket holes along the length of the boards. Attach the long boards to the short side boards with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue.

Make sure pocket holes are facing the same direction on both boards.




Build the bench legs by attaching a 1x4 piece to a 1x3 piece with 1 1/4" brad nails and wood glue. Attach a leg to the front corners of the bench frame with 1 1/2" wood screws and wood glue, from the inside of the frame. Keep legs flush with frame.







Lay the bench frame on top of the bench top and attach it to the bench top with 1 1/4" pocket hole screws. The back of the bench top should be flush with the back of the frame and there should be a 1 1/2" overhang on the front and sides of the bench frame.









To assemble the locker hutch, start by drilling 3/4" pocket holes into the ends of both side boards. Then, attach the side boards to the top board with 1 1/4" pocket hole screws and wood glue. The side boards should be flush with the ends of the top board.



Top of Locker





The locker dividers should side 1" from each end of the top board.



To build the frame for the hutch, drill 3/4" pocket holes into the ends of all the 1x3 boards and drill 3/4" pocket holes along the length of the two outside 1x3 boards.


Drill 3/4" pocket holes into the ends of the 1x4 boards and attach the 1x3 boards to the 1x4 boards with 1 1/4"pocket hole screws and wood glue. Make sure that the pocket holes on the outside 1x3 boards are facing out so that the frame can be attached to the inside of the locker hutch.








Attach the 1/4" plwyood sheet to the back of the hutch and attach it with 3/4" staples and wood glue. (You can also use brad nails).






Attach the bench to the wall from the inside of the bench frame into studs behind the wall. Use 3 1/2" wood screws.



Center the hutch so that it sits 1" from each end of the bench. Attach it to the bench with 1 1/4" pocket hole screws and wood glue. The back of the hutch should be flush with the back of the bench.
