
## **SUPPLY LIST**

Item	Quantity	Description
2 x 6 x 8	3	framing lumber ripped to 5"
2 x 4 x 8	2	framing lumber ripped to 3"
1 x 6 x 4	1	pine or whitewood
wood glue		
pocket hole screws	several	2.5" pocket hole screws
hairpin legs	4	check website for link
corner hardware	4	check website for link






## **CUT LIST**






Next, attach your aprons.
These are 2x4 boards that we ripped to 3" each. Mitere each edge to 45°, and attach them through the remaining pocket holes on the planks and into each apron.
Make sure to add a line of wood glue under each apronon this part as well. The top of the aprons will be flush with the top of the planks.





Now add the foot pads. These are 1x6 boards that are cut to 5" long each. Attach one to each corner the of table base using wood glue and 1.5" wood screws.

After you have those attached, you can attach each hairpin leg to the foot pads, then flip if over and add the finish to the wood.
