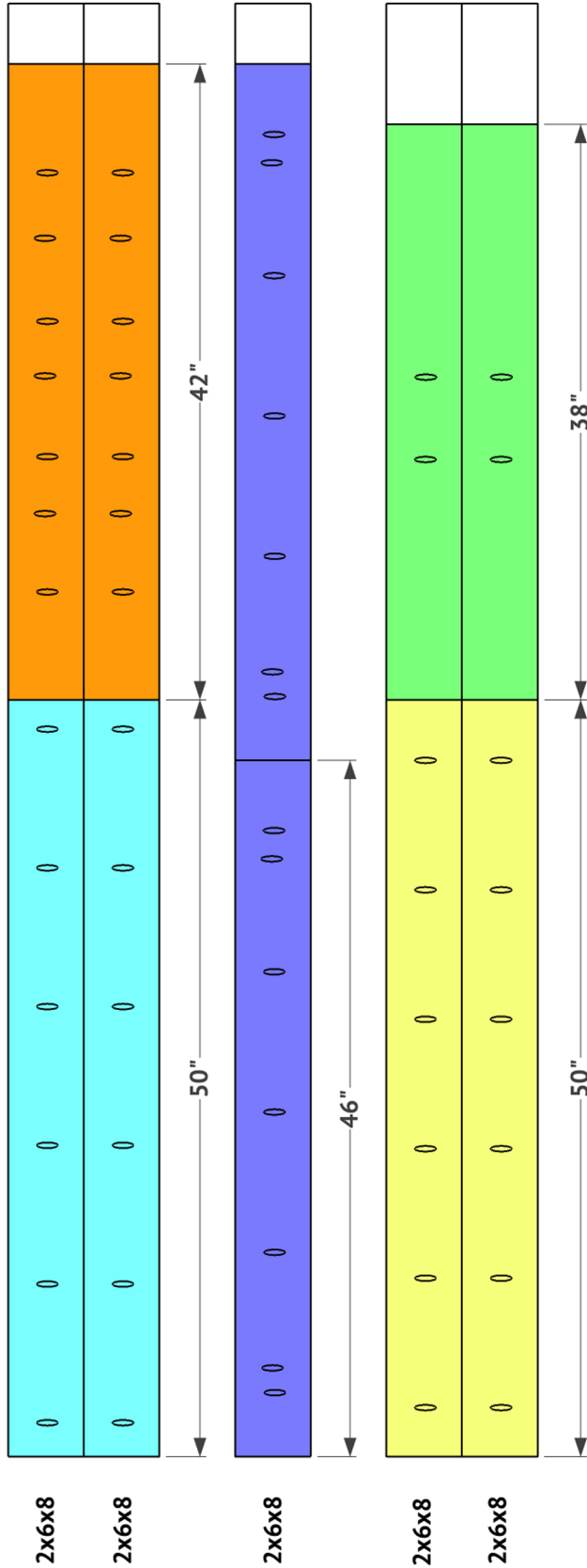

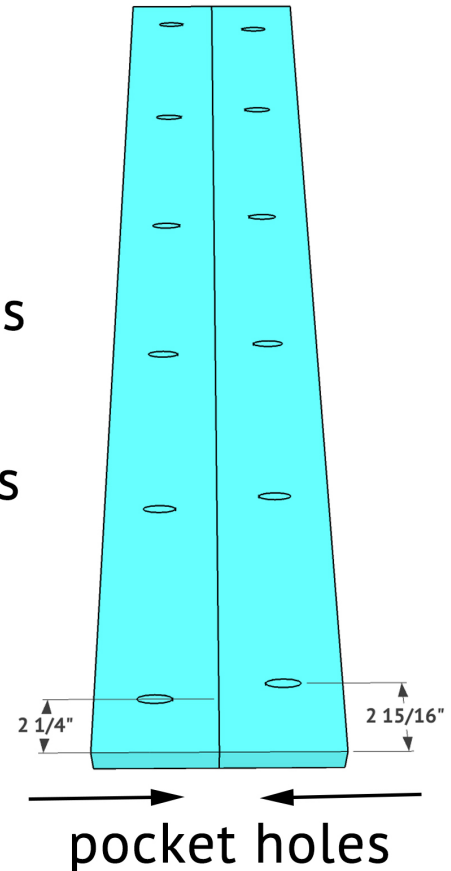
## CUT LIST



*Note: We ripped the round edges off of the 2x6 boards to make them 5" wide. This is not a necessary step. If you choose not to rip your round edges, please adjust the measurements for the table top.*

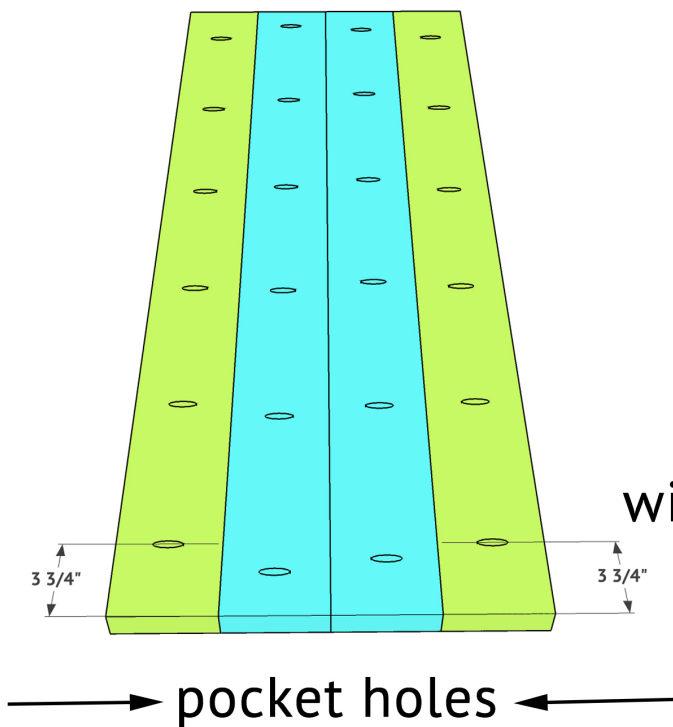

Cut all of the 2x6 planks to size and drill 1 1/2" pocket holes as referenced. Start assembling the table top by attaching the middle two planks to each other with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws.

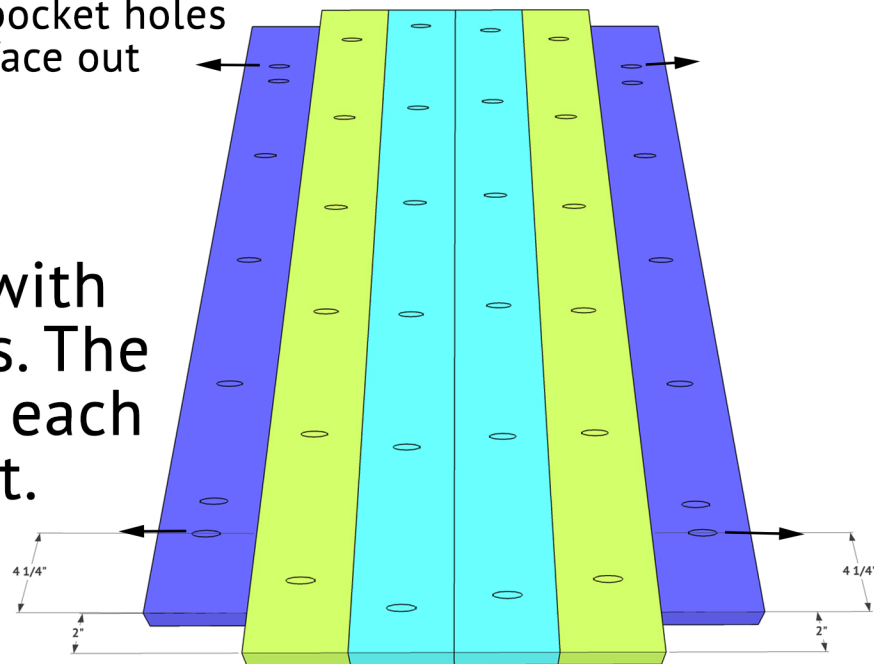
Attach the next two planks with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws.

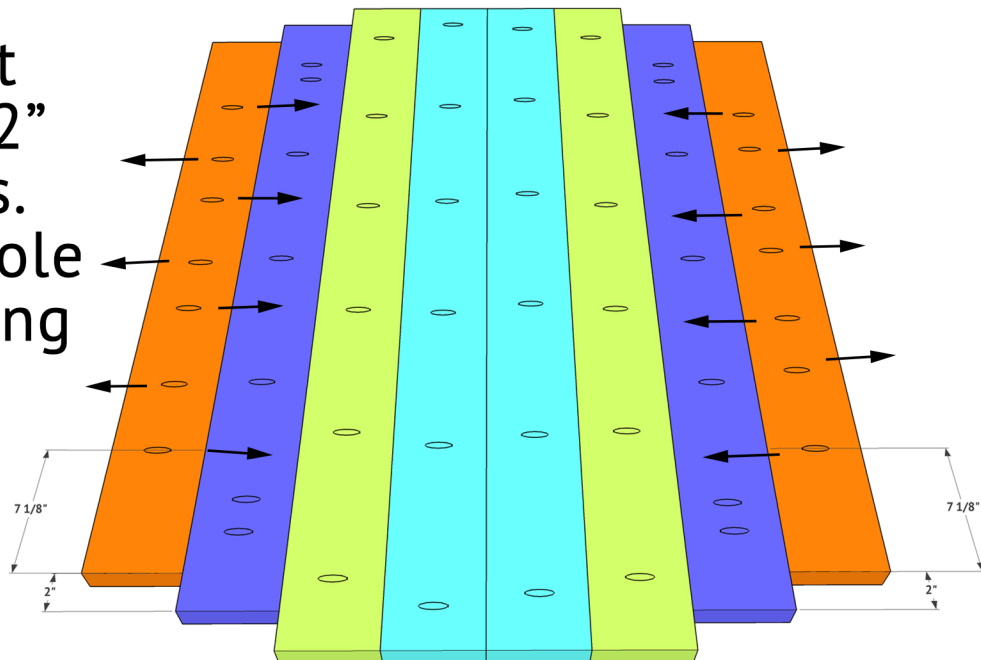
end pocket holes

Attach the next pieces with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws. The last two pocket holes on each board should face out.

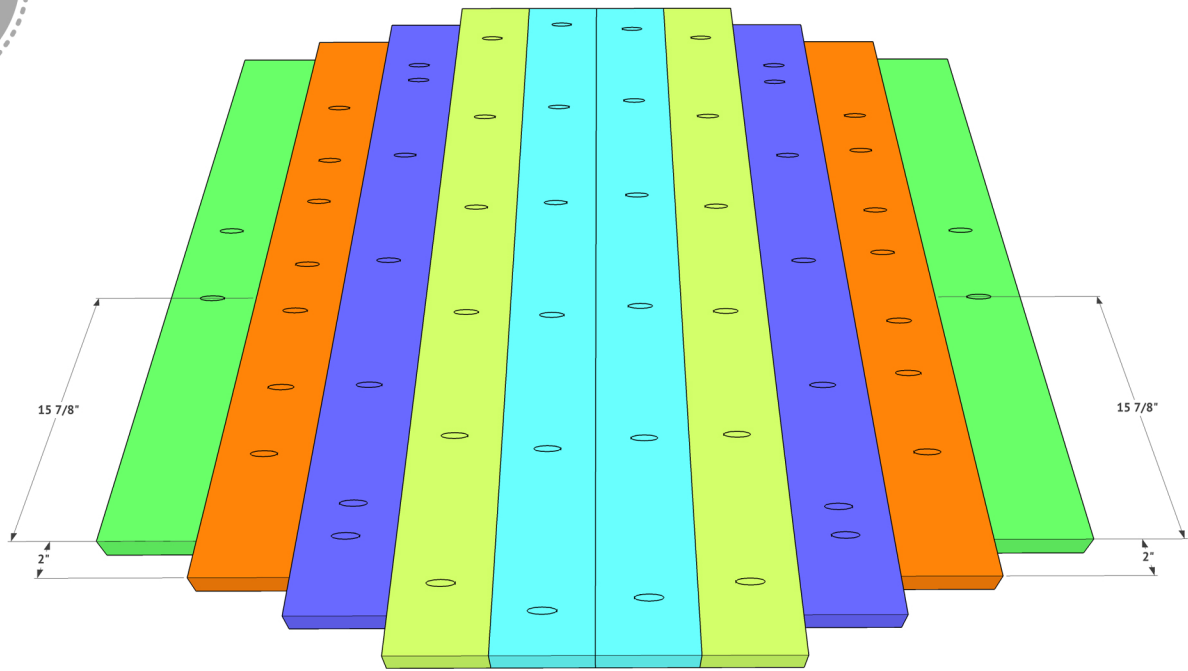

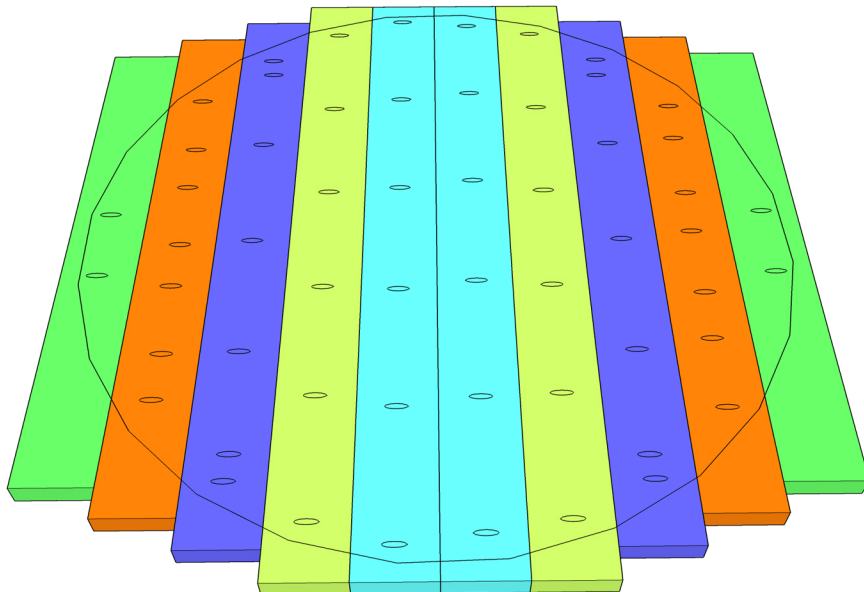
Attach the next set of planks with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws. Every other pocket hole should face in, starting with the ends.



5 Attach the final planks with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws.

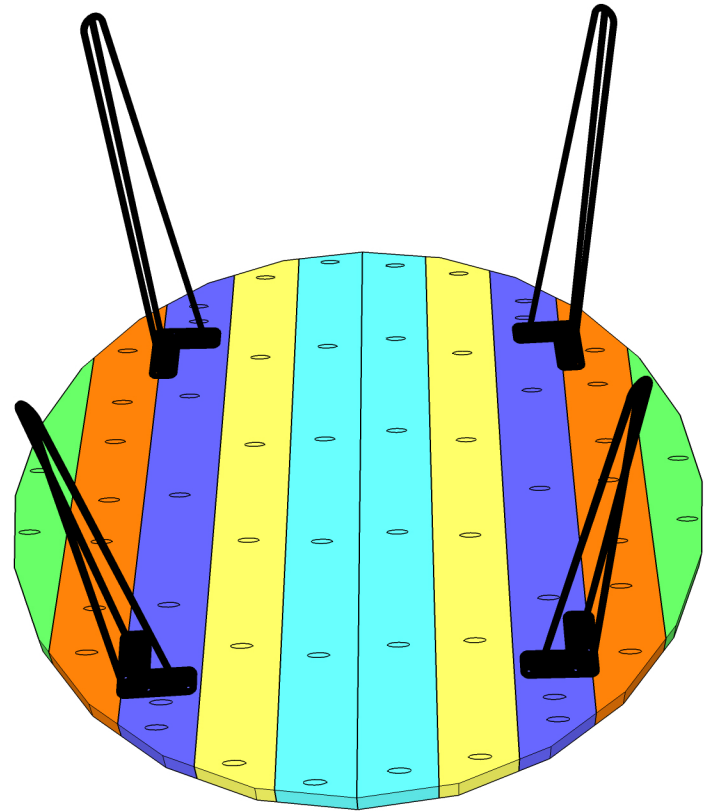


6 Use a plunge router attached to a jig and cut a 48" circle. Cut with the bottom of the planks facing up. You can see how we made our jig on the post on our website.





Attach four hairpin table legs to the bottom of the table top.
