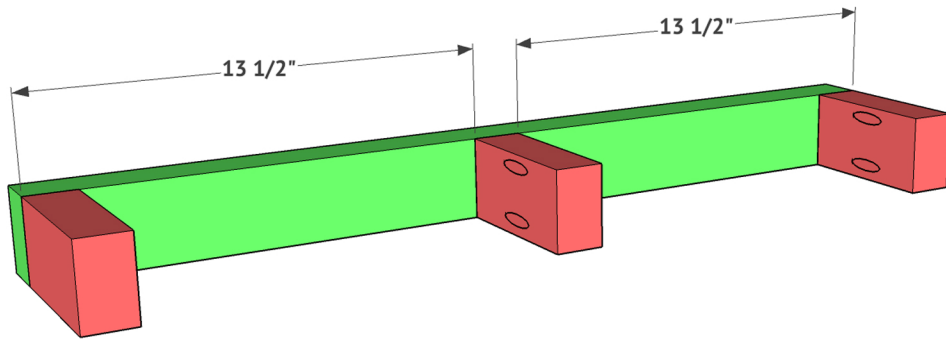
## CUT LIST

48"x96"x1/2"  
Hardwood Plywood



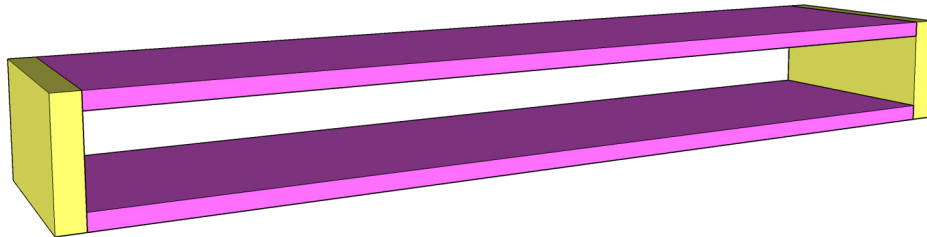

Cut the cleat pieces to size. Drill 1 1/2" pocket hole screws into the short cleat pieces. Attach them to the long cleat piece with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue.



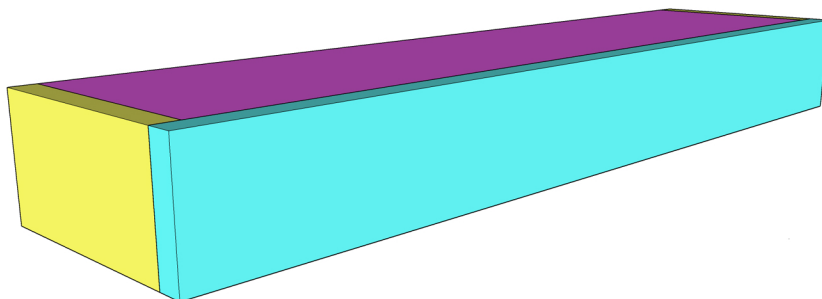

Cut the top and bottom plywood sheets to fit the length of the cleat and cut the side trim to the length of the cleat width. Attach the side trim pieces to the top and bottom pieces with 1" brad nails and wood glue.



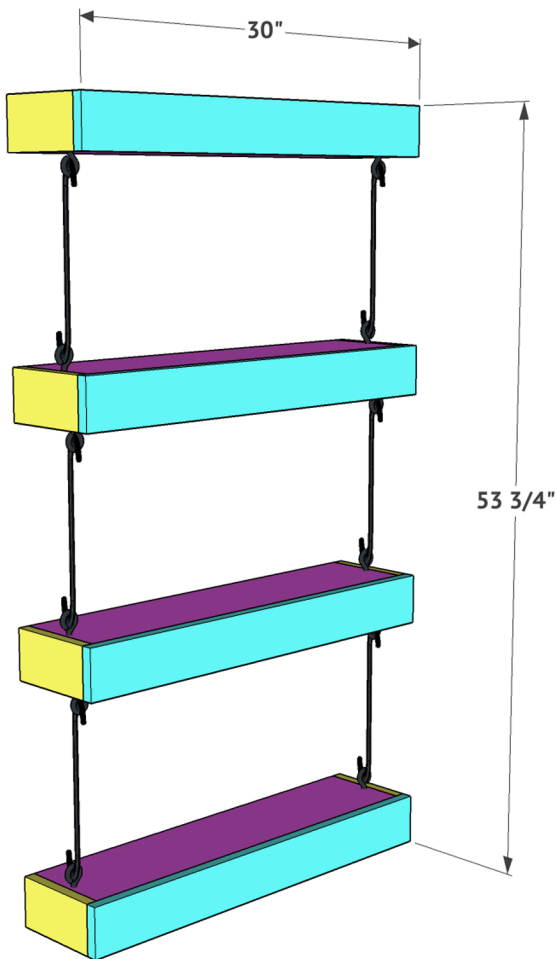
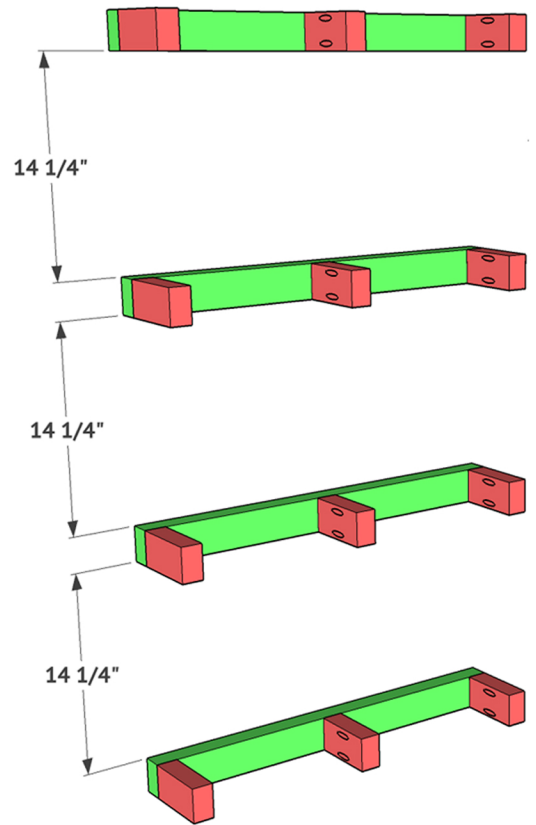

Cut the front trim piece to size and attach it to the shelf with 1" brad nails and wood glue. Now is a good time to stain the shelves!

The most important step in this project is to make sure you space the cleats out correctly. Attach the cleats to the studs behind the wall with 3" wood screws.



Slide the shelves over the cleats and secure with a wood screw on each end, from the top of the shelf, into the cleats. Check out the post on our site for details pics of how we added the hardware!
