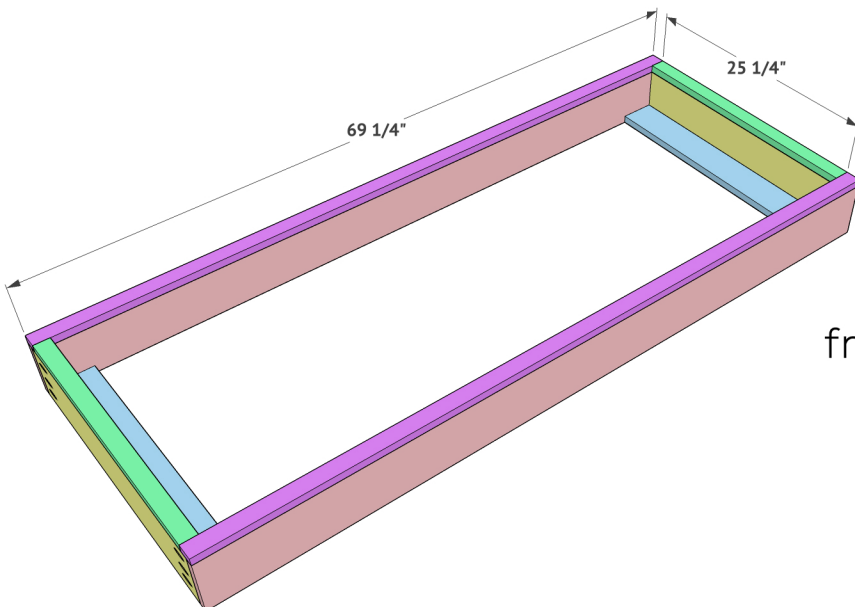




1 The first step is creating the box. These are 1x6 boards. Attach the shorter ends to the longer ends using wood glue and 1.25" pocket hole screws through 3/4" pocket holes.

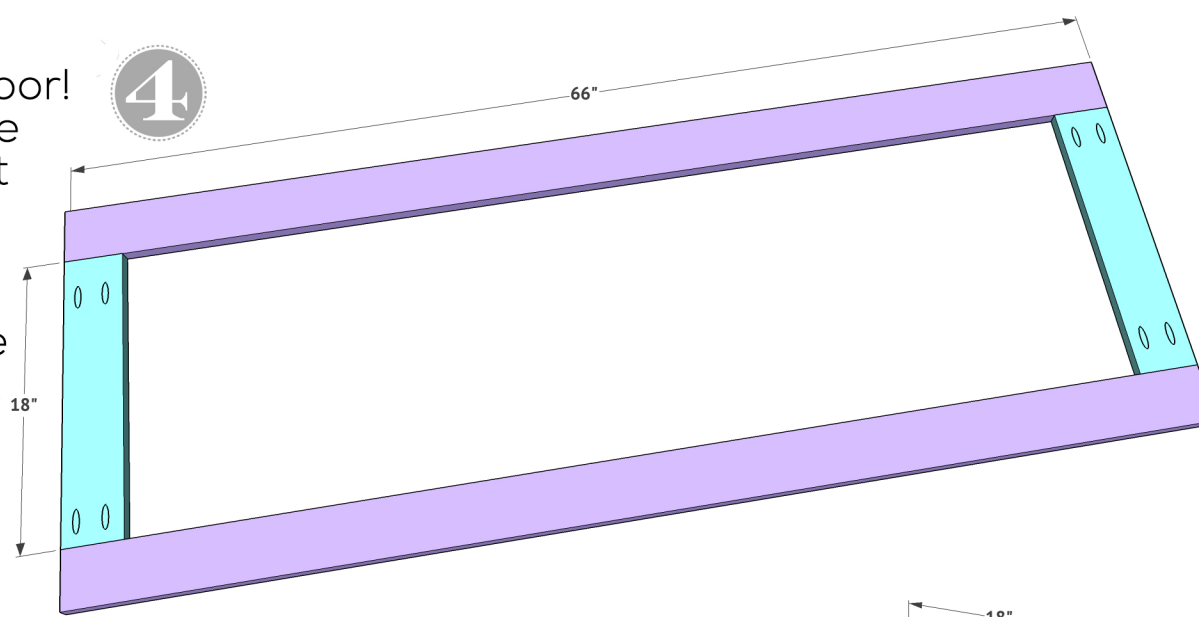


Now attach the support boards. These will be the boards that you will use to hold the cabinet to the wall. They are 1/4 boards. Create 3/4" pocket holes on each short end and along one longer end. Attach the board to the top and sides of the box using wood glue and 1.25" pocket hole screws.

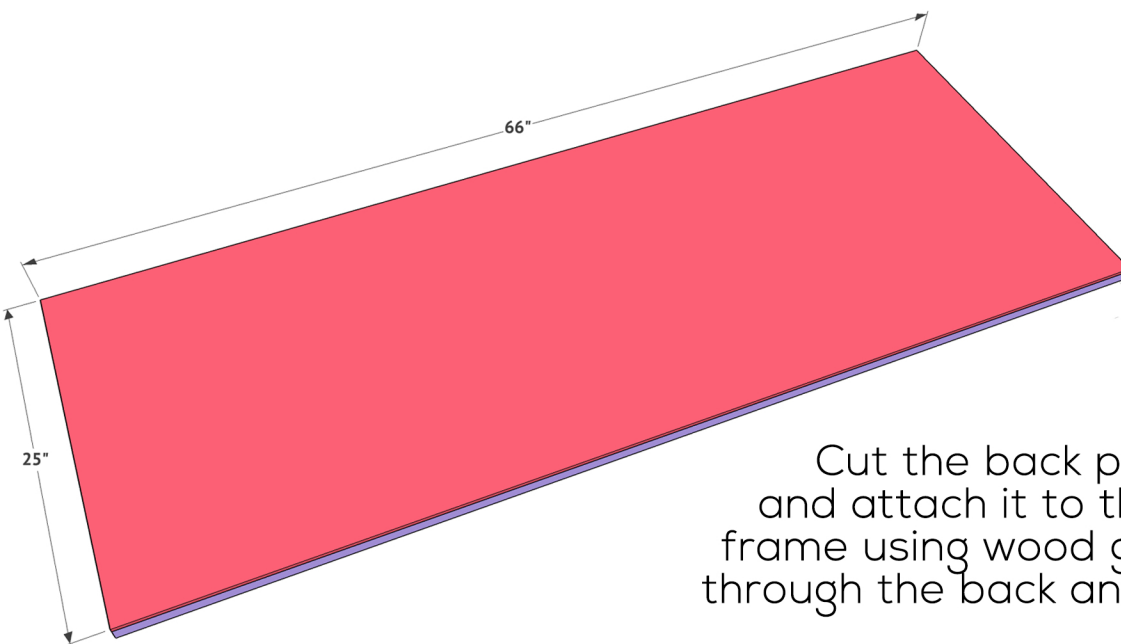
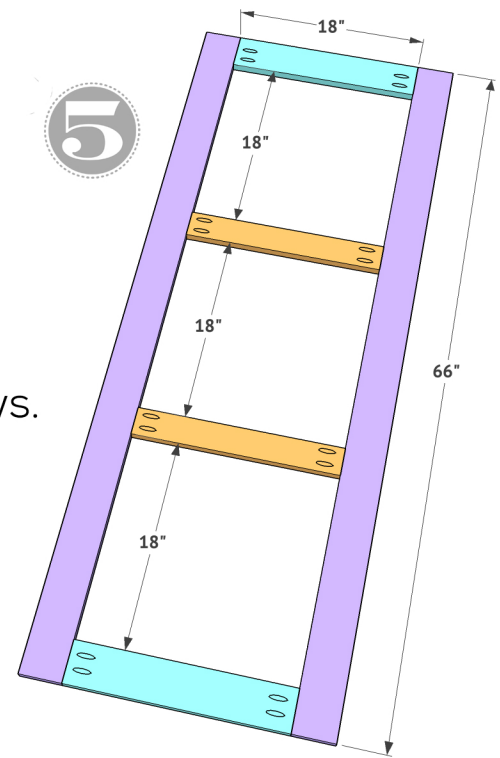


3 Create the face frame next. These are 1x2 boards. Build the frame with 1.25" pocket hole screws through 3/4" pocket holes. Once the frame is built, attach it to the front of the box using wood glue and 1.25" brad nails.

Moving on to the door!
Create the frame
of the door first
by attaching the
shorter ends to
the longer ends
using wood glue
and 1.25" pocket
hole screws
through 3/4"
pocket holes.



Attach the divider boards
next. These are 1x3 boards
spaced every 18". Attach
the to the frame using wood
glue and 1.25" pocket hole screws.

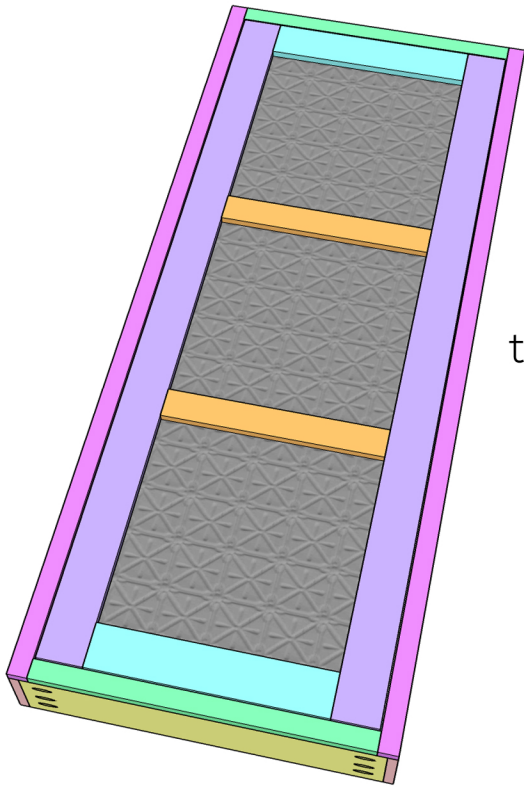
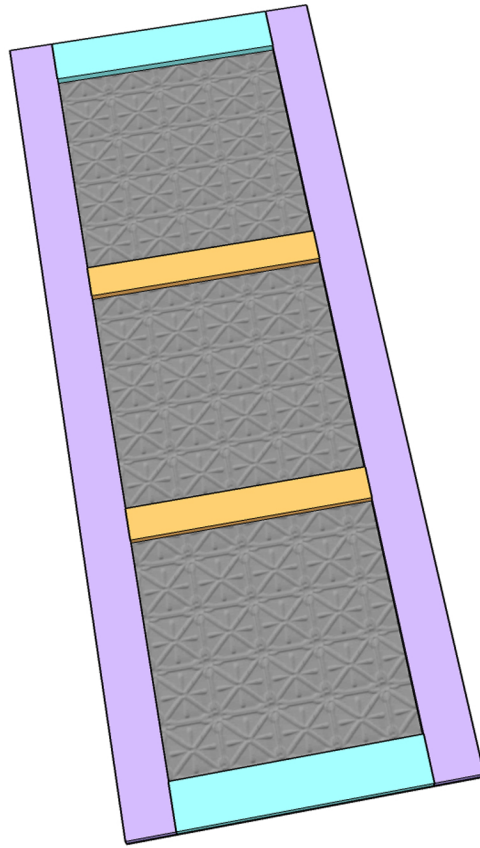


Cut the back panel to size
and attach it to the back of the
frame using wood glue and staples
through the back and into the frame.

The final step before attaching the door is adding the tin panels.

These are faux tin panels that you can find the link to on our website. They come in black, but check our website for details on how we finished ours. Attach the panels using hot glue or strong craft glue.
