



This is a cut list for the entire bed. This set of plans is for part one of the bed build.






Miter Detail:





Loft Bed Plans Part 2




Cut the front shelf trim pieces to size and drill 1 1/2" pocket holes on each end. Attach them to the leg supports with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue.








Cut the front desk trim piece to size and drill 1/2" pocket holes in each end. Attach it to the leg supports with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue.








Cut the short shelf pieces to size and drill 1/2" pocket holes in both ends. Attach them to the leg supports with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue. The pocket holes on the bottom pieces will face in and the rest will face down.






Cut the short desk pieces to size and drill 1 1/2" pocket holes in both ends. Attach them to the leg supports with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue. The pocket holes on the bottom pieces will face in and the rest will face down.








Measure and cut the plywood for the shelves. Drill 3/4" pocket holes around all edges and attach it to the shelf trim with 1 1/4" pocket hole screws. The plywood should be flush with the top of the trim.






Measure and cut the plywood for the desk. Drill 3/4" pocket holes around all edges and attach it to the shelf trim with 1 1/4" pocket hole screws. The plywood should be flush with the top of the trim.






Cut the ladder pieces to size. Drill 1 1/2" pocket holes on both ends of each rung.

Attach the rungs to the ladder legs with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue. Attach the ladder to the loft bed with 3" wood screws, from the back of the leg supports and into the ladder.








Cut the cleats to size and drill 1 1/2" pocket holes at both ends. Attach one to each side of the bed with 2 1/2" wood screws and 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue. Attach the center cleat with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue.



Cut the slat pieces to size. Even space them out across the cleats and attach them to the cleats with 1 1/4" wood screws.



Now just fill your exposed pocket holes, sand it down and add a finish!
