




## Modern Farmhouse Nightstand Supply List


Item	Quantity	Description
2 x 6 x 8	1	framing lumber
1 x 2 x 6	1	pine board
3/4" hardwood plywood	1	24" x 48"
1/4" hardwood plywood	1	24" x 48"
1.25" Kreg pocket hole screws	several	
2.5" Kreg pocket hole screws	12	
laminated pine project panel	1	refer to plan for size
wood glue


## **CUT LIST**






To save money on these nightstands, I decided to rip my 2 x 2 boards from a single 2 x 6 board. You can also purchase the 2 x 2 boards separately if you prefer. The sides of this nightstand are created using 3/4" hardwood plywood. Cut each side to size, and add 3/4" Kreg pocket holes down both long sides. Make sure to leave 7" of space between the top pocket hole and your second one. This will keep them hidden when the nightstand is complete.

The shelf boards are also created using 3/4" hardwood plywood boards. Cut each shelf piece to size, and add 3/4" pocket holes along all sides of both shelf boards. Attach the shelf boards to the side pieces using wood glue and 1.25" pocket hole screws. The bottom board will line up flush with the bottoms of the plywood sides, and the top shelf will line up 7 inches from the top of the plywood sides.









Attach the 2 x 2 horizontal support boards next. Add 1.5" pocket hole screws on each end of each  $2 \times 2$ board. These pocket holes will face down when you're building the nightstand. Attach each board to the side boards using wood glue in 2.5" pocket hole screws. The top board will line up flush with the top of the sides, and the other two support boards will be flush with the shelf boards.











Cut the back of the nightstand from 1/4" hardwood plywood.
Attach the back to the nightstand using wood glue and 3/4" staples through the plywood panel and into the nightstand frame.







Now you're ready to build the door!
Build the frame of the door first. Cut
the 1x2 board to size and add 3/4"
pocket holes on each end of both of
your shorter boards. Attach your
shorter boards to the longer boards
flush at the corners using 1.25" pocket
hole screws and wood glue to
form a frame.






Cut the panel of the door using 1/4" hardwood plywood. Attach it evenly to the back of the door frame using wood glue and 3/4" staples.



At this point, you are ready for paint or stain. I like to add the finish to the piece before adding all hardware.
