

2 1/2 Pocket Hole Screws

CUT LIST

Note: I used 2x6 for this entire build. I ripped the planks and breadboards to 5" wide and the aprons to 3" wide. This is not a necessary step but if you choose not to rip your boards, adjust the plans accordingly.






Cut the plank boards to size and drill 1 1/2" pocket holes on both ends of each board and one edge on all except one board. Attach the planks together with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws.

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


Cut the breadboard pieces to size and attach them to the planks with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws, through the pocket holes at the end of the planks.

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pocket hole screws and wood glue.



All finished!
